A	Ensure all disadvantaged pupils make progress in line with their peers in Maths, Reading & Writing	Effective assessment ensures gaps in knowledge and understanding are identified and addressed. Experienced and outstanding teachers providing small group focus teaching for less able pupils in Maths and English for all year groups. Early and effective intervention ensures daily learning objectives are met by all thus diminishing the difference.
B	Improve the % of PP children achieving greater depth	
C	Targeted support for those pupils with gaps in knowledge and understanding upon entry to year 3 to ensure all pupils make at least expected progress by the end of year 3.
