Many thanks to all those who took the time to complete our parent questionnaire earlier this term. A breakdown of your responses to the main questions is attached. We were delighted that the responses were overwhelmingly positive. One parent wrote, “*The school always puts the children first*”. This is definitely our aim.

More information on what the children are learning	The details of our full curriculum can be found on our website under the ‘Curriculum’ tab. Here you will find a full curriculum map for the whole school as well as lots of detail on each subject area. However, to help parents further, we will also now send home our curriculum overviews for each year group at beginning of every term. COVID has prevented us from having parents in school so we are delighted that we are able to reinstate our Show and Share afternoons this term. This is an opportunity for parents to come into school with their child so they are able to see their classroom and look at the work they have been doing. It is also an opportunity to chat informally to the teachers.
School Talk sessions focusing on how parents can help support their child’s mental health. School talk sessions at different times.	We have arranged for a session for parents on ‘Supporting your child with mental health and well-being’. This session will be delivered by Eikon who are a charity working to support young people in Surrey. This session will be on Thursday 21 st April and will be delivered at 7pm. Going forward, we will look to vary the timings of our School Talk sessions so that more parents are able to attend.

This has been a challenge as it relies on other schools to be able to field a team but we are delighted that we have been able to take part in more competitive matches this term. This will continue to be a focus for the school moving forward.</p> <p>We will also be reinstating our interhouse competitions as this is an opportunity for all children to take part in competitive sport and win points for their colour team.</p> <p>We are developing our Games curriculum and are looking to widen the range of sports on offer to the children in their games lessons. We will be introducing basketball and lacrosse next year.</p> <p>We are always keen to offer a wide variety of sports during our after-school club programme. If any parents are able to support us in running after school sports clubs, please do get in touch.</p>
