Local Litter Pick - 24-02-2023

Last Friday, the Eco Warriors were joined by our local MP, Ben Spencer and local councillor, Scott Lewis for another very successful trip out into the local community, picking up litter. We were all quite shocked at the fact that we picked up another 400+ pieces of litter between the school office and the zebra crossing just at the end of our road!

There did seem to be a large amount of after school snack packets/corners of packets on the school grounds so we ask our parents, carers and children to be mindful of this when opening their snacks – especially when it is windy outside.

We also asked the MP and local councillor a range of questions about our environment:

Why do you think there is so much litter?

A lot of people are lazy and need educating. What you do at school is very important.

Do we need more bins?

Yes.

Do we need more recycling bins?

Yes but people need to know how to recycle properly. If people put the wrong thing in the wrong bin then currently that can cause more problems at the recycling centres.

What are your thoughts on protecting wildlife?

It is super, super important. The number one priority is to ensure that there are places for wildlife to live. If you have a garden, ponds are great for animals. Getting rid of rubbish supports wildlife too.

What should the consequences be for dropping litter?

Firstly, we want to make sure that it doesn't happen in the first place. We need to teach everyone from an early age – that is why having Eco Warriors is such a great idea! Litter enforcement is hard especially near takeaway food outlets!

What happens if someone is seen dropping litter?

Sometimes, people do anti-social things that aren't very nice. The best thing we can do is to teach people at school and to focus on respect for people, nature and communities.

The cost of these 4 day courses will be:-

Members 1:1 lesson £108

Members 2:1 lesson £68 per pupil

Non-Members 1:1 £116

Non-Members 2:1 £76 per pupil

2:1 Private Lessons

Please be aware that we do not match swimmers for the 2:1 swimming lessons. The reason for this is because I will not know what ability each pupil is when booking.
