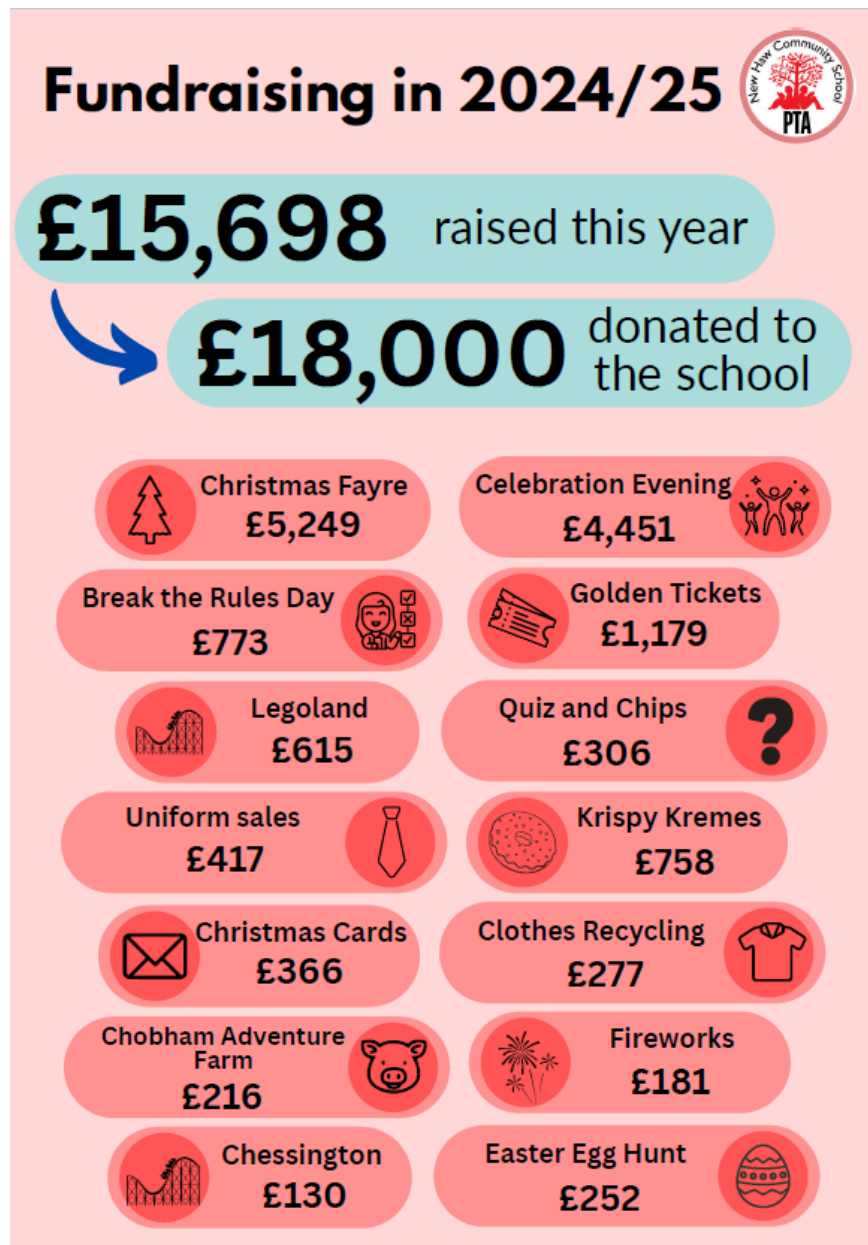

Promoting Healthy Eating at New Haw

At New Haw School, we are committed to promoting healthy lifestyles, and a key part of this is encouraging **healthy packed lunches**. We kindly ask for your support in helping us achieve this important goal.

A healthy packed lunch provides the balance of nutrients children need to support growth, concentration, and overall development. Ideally, lunchboxes should include:

- **Whole grain options** (such as brown bread, wraps, or pasta)
- **Protein-rich foods** (like lean meats, eggs, beans, or hummus)
- **Fruit and vegetables** for vitamins and fibre
- **Dairy** (such as yogurt or cheese) for calcium and protein
- **Healthy snacks** in moderation

By working together, we can ensure our children are fuelled for learning and develop lifelong healthy habits.



A Reminder About Illnesses

At this time of year, coughs, colds, and other seasonal illnesses are common. To help keep everyone healthy, we kindly ask parents and carers to keep children at home if they are unwell, particularly if they have a high temperature, vomiting, or diarrhoea.

Please remember that children should only return to school once they are feeling well enough to join in with lessons and activities. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must stay at home for **48 hours after the last episode**.

Thank you for helping us keep our school community safe and healthy.

Reminders

A Reminder About Earrings in PE and Games

For safety reasons, no child should be wearing earrings during PE or Games lessons. Using tape to cover earrings is not a safe alternative, as there is still a risk of them being caught or pulled. We kindly ask that parents ensure all jewellery is removed before the start of the school day on PE days.

This is part of our school policy and follows the guidance provided by Surrey County Council.

If a child is unable to remove their earrings, they may not be able to take part fully in the practical activities. In these cases, staff will contact parents to discuss when the earrings can be removed. Children who cannot participate physically will still remain involved in the lesson—for example, by helping with scoring, supporting their peers with feedback, or assisting the teacher in assessing skills.
