On the 5th of June we had the pleasure of welcoming our local member of parliament, Dr Ben Spencer. During his visit, the School Council asked him a range of questions from his hobbies to his career and what he loves doing for our local community. These were the highlights:

Q: What was his dream job as a child?

A: In his early secondary years he dreamed of becoming an inventor. During his late teenage years, he had an ambition to become an actor. Mentioning that "multiple skills of being an MP is similar to acting" like presenting yourself and being confident in front of a crowd.

Q: What was his job before becoming a MP?

A: Before entering politics he was a former doctor specialising in mental health. Part of the reason for his decision to become an MP was because as a doctor he felt like he couldn't address root problems that were causing sickness.

A: As our representative he enjoys travelling and visiting schools, advocating for his local area like helping and championing community initiatives and protecting green spaces. Thanks to his NHS mental health background, our representative also finds deep fulfilment helping to improve people's lives.
